Class:	207 Free Motion Ruler Quilting
Level:	Level 2 – Students should be aware of and have worked on projects using techniques listed in level 1 description.
Type:	Machine Quilting

Description:	In this class we will learn to use quilting rulers and free motion quilting to finish those quilt tops. Bring a quilt top you've pieced (please have it sandwiched using your preferred sandwiching technique) or several fat quarter sandwiches to practice on in class. Please see Supply list for complete requirements.
	It's very important the student purchase the ruler foot for their machine. If they have quilting rulers they should bring them to class. I have some available to share but not enough for a full class.

Class Requirements:

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Class Supplies:

- Sewing Machine in working condition, Foot pedal, Power Cord, Sewing Machine Manual
- Extra Bobbins please wind before we start class so you won't have to wind during class.
- Notebook to take notes
- Pencil/Pen



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Ruler Foot (Please purchase the one manufactured by your machine



company.)

- Free Motion rulers (I prefer the rulers from Creative Grid developed for Angela Walters, but bring any you have. They are expensive so if you don't own any, I have a few I can share in class.)
- Supreme Slider or wax if you use it. (I don't use either so if you don't own it, don't buy it.)
- Quilting Gloves important
- Single needle throat plate, if you have one. Do not purchase.
- Threads bring a neutral 50 weight thread, and a variegated thread (please feel free to bring different types of threads to play with including metallics, 12 weights, Glide, etc.)
- Schmetz needles size 90/14 Universal or sharp, bring several. Needles tend to get broken while free motion quilting.
- ruler a 3" x 12" will work, it doesn't need to be bigger
- Marking pen or pencil we will be marking on your quilt top, so bring your favorite marking implement
- scissors
- 2 fat quarter quilt sandwiches it is a good idea to use solid colored fabrics or low volume fabrics. We will use these to practice before we actually start quilting on our quilt.

Fabric Requirements:

 Quilt top. Your quilt top should be crib sized. I suggest you bring one that has solid squares, 4-patches, flying geese and a couple of 2 inch straight border areas. This will give you plenty of areas to quilt. This is what mine looks like:



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You can just bring several fat quarter sandwiches if you prefer.
