

Quilt Camp at Cedar Lakes
2021 Block Exchange

This block is reminiscent of Peg's knots and we are sure she would have loved it! It is a variation of a log cabin block. The center is cut $2\frac{1}{2}$ " and there are 3 logs that are units: 9, 12, and 17. Please use two fabrics : black for the dark logs and batik for the light logs. The block will be 12" when finished ($12\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished). All logs are cut $1\frac{1}{2}$ " wide and the following lengths:

BLACK

- #2 $2\frac{1}{2}$ "
- #3 $3\frac{1}{2}$ "
- #4 $3\frac{1}{2}$ "
- #7 $5\frac{1}{2}$ "
- #10 $6\frac{1}{2}$ "
- #11 $7\frac{1}{2}$ "
- #13 $7\frac{1}{2}$ "
- #15 $9\frac{1}{2}$ "
- #18 $10\frac{1}{2}$ "
- #19 $11\frac{1}{2}$ "
- #20 $11\frac{1}{2}$ "
- #21 $12\frac{1}{2}$ "

BATIK

- #1 center square is $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ "
- #5 $3\frac{1}{2}$ "
- #6 $5\frac{1}{2}$ "
- #8 $5\frac{1}{2}$ "
- #9* $4\frac{1}{2}$ "
- #12* $5\frac{1}{2}$ "
- #14 $9\frac{1}{2}$ "
- #16 $9\frac{1}{2}$ "
- #17* $6\frac{1}{2}$ "

4 - $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares to use in units*

Assemble using the pictures as your guide. Note the units made for pieces 9,12, and 17. You can make one or several blocks to exchange. See the website for more information on the block exchange.
