Class Requirements:

- The pattern will be provided by the teacher.
- **Clearview™ 60-degree Triangle Ruler**, 10" or larger, available on-line at [www.ctpub.com](http://www.ctpub.com) or Amazon if your local quilt shop doesn't have it, Retail \$25.  
**OR** Creative Grids 60-degree triangle ruler (\*\*see note below)

Class Supplies:

- Sewing machine, power cord, and foot pedal (please be comfortable with its operation)
- Basic sewing supplies including thread, pins, and extra machine needles
- Rotary cutting ruler with 60-degree line (6x12 or 8x12 recommended)
- Rotary cutter and mat
- Personal iron will be helpful if you have room to pack it

Fabric Requirements:

Ten fabrics, minimum 1/4 yd each of three light, three medium, and three dark value fabrics, plus an accent/focus fabric for the block centers. One effective way to select fabrics is to grade from light to dark in each of the three values (see examples).

Pre-Class Instructions:

A 50% liquid starch solution (half starch/half water) or a liberal spray of Best Press is recommended before cutting fabric. This will make it easier to cut an accurate strip and will stabilize bias sub-cuts.

Because cutting surfaces are at a premium in class (not to mention most of us are more accurate when we can take our time at home), please come to class with the following:

Fabric – lightest (1) to darkest (3)			Full width of fabric
Light 1	1-1/2"	6	12
Light 2	1-1/2"	3	6
Light 3	1-1/2"	3	6
Medium 1	1-1/2"	3	6
Medium 2	1-1/2"	3	6
Medium 3	1-1/2"	6	12
Dark 1	1-1/2"	3	6
Dark 2	1-1/2"	6	12
Dark 3	1-1/2"	6	12
<b>Accent/Focus</b>	<b>2-1/2"</b>	<b>1</b>	<b>2</b>

\*\*The technique is specifically designed for the Clearview™ ruler. The Creative Grids ruler will work with a simple adjustment to the pattern measurements. While an attempt can be made to accommodate other brands, their markings are not exactly the same as Clearview; therefore, results cannot be guaranteed. If you are investing in a 60° ruler for the first time, the Clearview 10" or 12" size is recommended. If you purchased a smaller size for a previous class, bring that and you can borrow another when you need a larger size.
