Level:	<b>Level 3</b> – Includes advanced techniques addressed in class project, including but not limited to ‘Y’ seams, partial seams, hidden seams, and/or complex construction techniques.
Type:	Machine Piecing

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Description:	Twirl is a charming quilt made with swirling, twirling blocks, using two contrasting colorways. My sample is made with pinks for the flowers against several light backgrounds. For those of you who were in my Blue Onion class in 2023, you may remember that we chose this pattern to use the "Ovals Always" ruler by Creative Grids again. This is a challenging project that will build upon last year's skill set.

Class Requirements:

- Twirl pattern by Saginaw St. Quilts
- “Ovals Always” Ruler by Creative Grids

Class Supplies:

- Sewing machine, in good working order. Please bring whatever foot for your machine that allows you to sew an accurate 1/4” seam. Don’t forget the power cord and foot pedal. It can also be helpful to bring along the User Manual.
- Thread - a color that will blend well with your fabrics. I like to use light gray.
- Rotary cutter, mat, large and small rulers
- Basic sewing supplies (ie. Scissors, pins, seam ripper)

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Fabric Requirements:

- 1/2 yd each of 6 different light value (or dark) prints for background
- 1/2 yd each of 6 different med/dark (or light) prints for arcs.
- I put borders on mine, although the pattern does not give instructions for borders. This would be optional for you but if you choose to, I used 1 yard for inner, smaller border and binding, and 1 1/4 yard for my outer border.

Pre-class cutting instructions:

- It would be very helpful for you to do the basic cutting instructions ahead of time. **Please follow the pattern instructions carefully.**
- From each of the 6 background prints, cut 2 strips, 8" wide. Crosscut each strip into 4 rectangles, 8" x 9 1/2" each, for a total of 48.
- From each of the 6 flower (Twirl) prints, cut 2 strips, 7" wide. Crosscut each strip into 1 rectangle, 4" x 7" and 4 rectangles 7" x 8 1/2" each, for a total of 48.
